- ♦ Good.

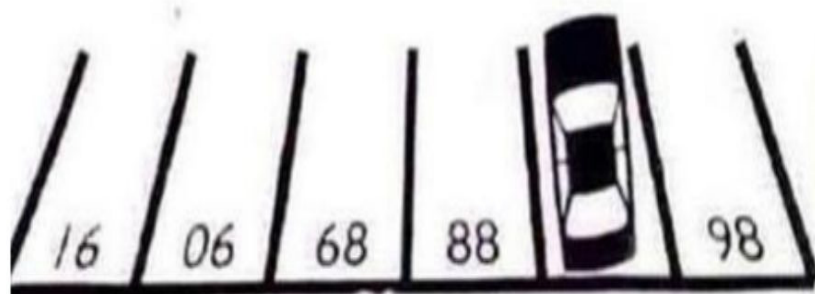
### How is St John's different from your school?
